

Transportation Expo Expecting at Least 25,000 for North Georgia Air and Car Show

On October 21-22, the skies over Greater Rome will be filled with unusual sights and sounds, and the landscape of *Richard B. Russell Regional Airport* will fill with over 100 aircraft from many locales and over 500 competition classic cars and trucks gathered for the **North Georgia Air and Car Show**.

Sponsored by *Coosa Valley Federal Credit Union* and produced by *Transportation Expo of Kennesaw, Georgia*, the event is expected to attract between 25,000-30,000 spectators over the two days.

The show is scheduled to include military jets and other military aircraft, Warbirds, aerobatic performers, plus Chris Rounds' T-33 Red Knight Jet.

The event is also scheduled to feature a remote control aircraft demonstration featuring the Flying Lawn Mower, a Pearl Harbor reenactment demonstration by members of the Dixie Wing of the Commemorative Air Force, two sets of Heritage Flights, and a Warbird flyover.

On Saturday, there will be a show displaying over 500 classic cars and trucks. In addition, there will be a classic car and truck swap meet and car corral both Saturday and Sunday.

There are even plans for a 1940's hangar dinner/dance, featuring a full sit-down dinner and a 17-piece band!
